**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE
MALAGA COUNTY WATER DISTRICT
AUTHORIZING NEW DISTRICT BANK ACCOUNT**

WHEREAS, the Malaga County Water District (District) is a County Water District duly formed and existing pursuant to California Water Code Section 30000, et. seq.; and

WHEREAS the District has an existing checking account at Wells Fargo Bank; and

WHEREAS, the District has several grant projects requiring bridge funding from the Rural Communities Assistance Corporation; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors desires to and hereby does authorize the opening of a separate checking account at Wells Fargo Bank to be used only for monies received from RCAC as Bridge Funding on Grant Projects.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE MALAGA COUNTY WATER DISTRICT AS FOLLOWS:

4. The Officers of the District are as follows: President (pursuant to California Water Code Section 30520, Charles Garabedian, Jr.; Vice-President (pursuant to California Water Code Section 30520, Salvador Cerrillo; Secretary to the Board (pursuant to California Water Code Section 30540(a)) Norma Melendez; and Auditor (pursuant to California Water Code Section 30540(b), Jaribu Nelson, CPA.
5. The Board of Directors hereby authorizes the opening of a new separate checking account at Wells Fargo Bank to be used only for monies related to RCAC Bridge Funding.

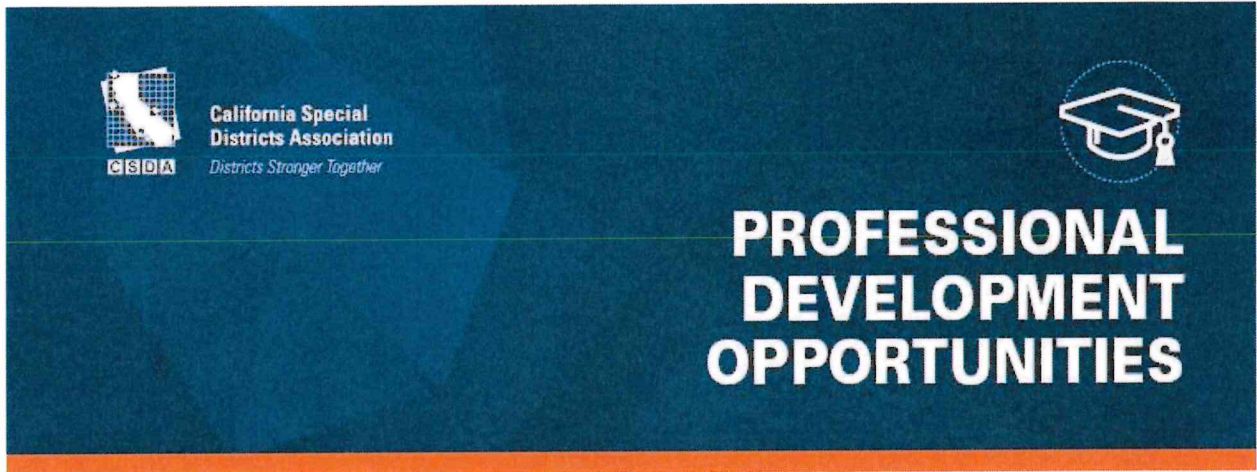

b. **Accounts Payable: Well #5 PG&E Project Extension Agreement.**

5. Old Business:

a. **Groundwater Recharge Agreement: Basin "CF".** Consideration and potential approval of a three-party agreement between MCWD, FID, and FMFCD to utilize Basin "CF" for the 2025 recharge season. Key terms include a \$4.00/AF maintenance fee and operational oversight by FMFCD. This agreement ensures the capture of MCWD's water entitlement for local groundwater benefit.

Recommended action: To approve the agreement as presented with FMFCD and FID and authorize Vice President, Salvador Cerrillo, to execute the document.

Motion by Director Cerrillo, Jr.; Second by Director Tovar, Jr. and by a 5-0 vote to approve agreement with FMFCD and FID and authorize the Vice President to execute agreement.

6. New Business:

- a. **Resolution 03-24-2026-- Public Hearing of the 2026 Water Supply Report.** AB 2532 requires a Public Hearing to be held for the bi-annual Water Supply Report. The 2024 Water Supply Report was accepted on February 19, 2026, and a Notice of Public Hearing was published for this hearing. Recommended Action: Approve Resolution 03-24-2026, A Resolution of the Board of Directors of the Malaga County Water District Adopting the 2026 Water Supply Report.

- b. **Resolution 03-24-2026A.** An agreement between the Fresno County Registrar of Voters and the Malaga CWD to provide County access to and usage of the Arriaga Community Center and parking lot for the General Election of November 5, 2024. This includes four days of usage from November 2nd to November 4th from 9:00am to 5:00pm and November 5th from 7:00am to 8:00pm. Conditions include secure storage area to store voting equipment and supplies up to 5-days prior to the first Voting Day and during the Voting Days.

Recommended action: to approve Resolution No. 03-24-2026A to authorize President Charles Garabedian, Jr. to sign and enter an agreement with the Fresno County Elections Department to use the Arriaga Community Center as a voting center.

Motion by Vice President Cerrillo; Second by Director Tovar, jr. and by a 5-0 vote to approve Resolution 03-24-2026A as presented.

- c. **District Sampling Stations.** District staff received three quotes for the installation of sampling stations throughout the district which are as follows:
1. GSE Construction, \$338,530.00
 2. W.M. Lyles, Co., \$90,720.00
 3. Charles Testerman, \$57,569.00

At this time, the District does not have sufficient funds available in the current budget to proceed with the full installation. There are alternative funding sources provided by the California Rural Water Association. On May 21 and 29 the agency will hold a Funding Fair to provide an opportunity to obtain information about currently available infrastructure grant, loan and bond financing programs and options.

Recommended action: That the Board review the submitted quotes and provide direction to staff to pursue specific grant opportunities or financing options to fund the project.

He also reported that it was discovered that a well that was thought to have been destroyed was not properly destroyed. It will cost approximately over \$17,000 to properly close abandoned well.

VP Cerrillo reported that the district received 4 lifeguard applications. They will be enrolled in lifeguard certification classes. He also reported that Heavy Road and Rail broke a fire hydrant. The company has agreed to pay for the repairs.
